- 6. I Am the Way, the Truth and the Life: Read John 14:1-7
- 7. I Am the True Vine: Read *John 15:1-8*
- There are more "I Am" statements that are not metaphors (symbolic of something else) as those statements above.
- There are "I Am" statements that are declarations of God's name applied by Jesus to Himself:
- John 4:25-26: I Am the Messiah
- John 8:58
- John 18:1-8 I Am He

# Easter Sunrise Craft



## Supplies you'll need:

- □ Paper Plate, any size (1 per child)
- □ Paint, Crayons or Colored Pencils
- Black Construction Paper

- □ Glue or Stapler
- White Crayon or Pen (optional)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Instruct children to color a sunrise on the paper plate, starting with yellow, then adding orange, red, purple and finally blue.
- 2. Fold black construction paper in half and cut out crosses (or precut, depending on age).
- 3. Attach black construction paper to paper plate using a stapler or glue (we used staples).
- 4. Optional: Write a Bible verse or "He is Risen!" on the bottom of the black construction paper.

Welcome: Reverend Morgan, declaring a quorum, welcomed all to the February 20, 2023 Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Devotion – Joanne DiBlasi

Manage the Greenhouse of your Heart. Taken from a Max Lucado Devotional. People harvest what they plant. Read *Galatians 6:7-10. Think of your heart as a Greenhouse.* It is difficult for the Holy Spirit to accomplish His work in us and through us when our hearts hold onto "weeds and thorns." (Anger, bitterness, resentment, etc.) Read *Psalm 103:12-18 Preparing the Heart.* 

As our lives and surroundings get more chaotic, we need to stay focused and faithful to our Lord God so we can be that example of Hope to those around us. We need to prepare our hearts through confession for God to work His will in it, bringing about *Psalm 103:12*. Is my heart a Greenhouse of weeds, rocks and thorns? Or is it healthy soil which will produce flowers of Hope, Truth and Optimism. Confession invites God to work the soil of our soul.

<u>Around the Room -</u> The Elders, Brad and myself went around the room and shared our concerns. Brad closed this section with prayer.

#### Moderator Time - Rev. Brad Morgan

Brad deferred his Moderator Time to Mike Atzert. The Session welcomed Mike Atzert our COM Liaison to the Business Meeting. He will be conducting the Exit Interview regarding Pastor Dan Dorrow. He asked Session to give their positive thoughts. Examples were: Miracles can happen through prayer, more bible based, the Presbytery is better, Joanne Dorrow was a big part of our Music Ministry. Some of the challenges were: The Pastor came during Covid, more availability was needed here at the church.

What should the next step be? Where will our next minister come from, and what type of leader do we need? Mike asked the Session to pray about the next step, and it should be with energy and excitement. Through the Presbytery, there is a regional website "Call Finders" where churches can post who or what type of leadership they are looking for. Pastors that are looking for a church can also post their information on the website as well. Sue was asked to pull out the old pastor job position, and it may be possible to put an updated pastor job description on this website. Mike will send Sue the information to the website if needed. He talked about different ways a new pastor is found, and more on finding a new pastor to be discussed at future business meetings. Joanne talked about how we are set for Pastor Gregory to come on the next few months of Communion Sundays. As well as Past and Present Elders giving the sermons on non-communion Sundays.

**Dissolution Agreement Letter-** between Pastor Dan Dorrow and the First Presbyterian Church of Lambertville: A **motion** was brought forth regarding the letter, and was seconded and approved by Session. The letter was signed by Joanne DiBlasi (Session member), Mike Atzert (COM), Pastor Brad Morgan (Moderator), and Susan McCloughan (Clerk). Also, a Separation Ethics Covenant was signed by Dan, Sue and Mike Atzert. Both letters are on file in the Church Office. The letters will be talked about at the Annual Meeting on 2/26/23.

#### Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

**Review of Minutes**: A **motion** was called to approve the minutes from January 16, 2023. All were in favor. The minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter.

**Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence-** A tax id letter was drawn up by Heather M., in regards to act in the church's behalf, regarding recovering unclaimed funds, and given to Session to sign. It was signed, forwarded to Heather and is on file in the Church Office. The Session Minutes Review Checklist was received by Sue for this year's review for the Presbytery. This will be completed soon.

#### Calendar Highlights from March-May 2023

Communion is scheduled for 3/5, 4/30 and 5/7, with Pastor Gregory. Care & Share will continue on Communion Sundays with different groups hosting. Soup Sales are in the month of March. The last day for Skating and Friday Night Hang is March 10<sup>th</sup>. The last day for LBL is 3/18. Men's Bible Study will continue on mornings once a month at Sneddon's. Airy Pres., and Good Friday to be hosted by First Pres. of Lambertville, both to be at 7:00 pm. There will be a pot-luck for Becky and Rich Hopkins on Sunday 4/2, after church. Easter Sunday 4/9, the Deacons will be sponsoring the Breakfast and the Children's Easter Egg Hunt. The Annual Shad Fest is April 22-23, from 11:00 am-5:00 pm. Karen and Heidi will be selling hot dogs for fundraising. The COC will be in the Gym from 4/21-4/23 for their poster auction. We will be having a special event here at 9:00 am on Sunday 4/23-Shad Fest Sunday during worship time. More details to come soon. The National Day of Prayer is Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>. The Women's Retreat is scheduled for Friday May 19 -21 at Sandy Cove in North East, MD. Pastor Gregory will be here on Memorial Day Sunday, 5/28.

**Annual Meeting on 2/26/23-** Brad asked if the minutes were approved at the meeting. The congregation authorizes Session to approve the minutes that are taken at a later upcoming Session Business Meeting. **Installation Sunday of Church Officers-** Is March 5<sup>th</sup>, and Pastor Gregory will be here, as well as Communion. This was ok with the Presbytery.

**2022 Church Statistical Report**- The report was sent to the Session via email on 1/31/23. Then was submitted to the Presbytery on 2/14/23. A **motion** was to approve the Statistical Report tonight. The report was approved.

#### Worship and Music/Church Life - Joanne DiBlasi/Karen Thatcher

Insurance Review- Nothing for tonight's meeting.

Children's Time- is going well.

**Sight & Sound-** A sign-up will be posted in the downstairs hallway for the show on 9/23/23. Karen is the POC.

Audio Recordings-Are being done at this time, but Joanne will reach out to George W. regarding the glitches that are happening to see if they can be fixed.

Accompanist/Pianist- The Job Description was renewed on the AGO website. We haven't had any new resumes. We have Accompanists until May. They are listed in the weekly bulletins.

#### **Building and Grounds** – Don Pidcock

The **new technology** for recording our church service was discussed, and is currently being worked on by Don, Stephen M. and Pastor Brad. Stephen sent an email to Session regarding the camera, laptop, etc.

Sue spoke about the **organ**. We are waiting for an estimate from Steve Emery for more repairs to be done. Sue will keep the Session updated on its progress.

Church Roof- The gutters need to be replaced as well. Updates to come.

**Small Church Bathroom-** Joanne gave an estimate tonight for repairs needed to the bathroom. The ceiling and walls need to be fixed, as well as other items. The **motion** was made to have Joanne and Addie repair the bathroom, and all were in favor. Joanne and Addie will be repairing the bathroom under the stairs as soon as possible. The Church Hallway was also discussed, and will be repaired soon. In the spring, the front doors of the Church will be painted.

**Skating and Friday Night Hang-** The last Friday for both is March 10<sup>th</sup>. Don mentioned that Steve and Jen Chernoski are doing a good job with skating. Steve is looking to have more parental involvement in Friday Night Hang.

**Westminster House-**Don will be getting a split heating system for the Church Office. There have been many issues as of recent with the heating system.

#### Budget and Finance - Karen Thatcher

Our Year-to-Date Summary was given out, from 1/1-2/20/23, and we are over in our Plate \$690.83. The Morgan Stanley and Plate Summary information was given out to Session and they were asked to review the information, and to get in touch with Heather if they should have any questions.


