

# From Our Elder ~ Phil McCloughan

While Driving to Williamsburg Virginia we passed this roadside marker for Rev. Francis Makemie, who is credited for starting the Presbyterian Church in The New World:



## 1683 - Father of American Presbyterianism Rev. Francis Makemie

The man known as the 'Father of American Presbyterianism' was born near Ramelton, County Donegal, around 1658. He studied at Glasgow University, where Ulster Presbyterian students were known as 'Scoto-Hibernicus' or Scotch-Irish. He was licensed by the Laggan Presbytery and ordained for work in America in 1683. Soon afterwards, he began a pioneering ministry that would last until his death in 1708.

## **Ministry**

Makemie traveled widely in the course of his ministry, preaching in many places along the eastern seaboard of America as well as in the West Indies. He was the pastor of Rehoboth Presbyterian Church, Maryland, which has been described as the birthplace of the Presbyterian Church in the United States. In 1706, Makemie was instrumental in organizing the first presbytery in America, which met in Philadelphia. The marker was an unexpected surprise to see. As we were traveling on vacation towards Jamestown, Yorktown and Williamsburg. To learn more about the History and Founding of this country.

February 24, 2025 Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

### 3:15 PM-Devotion, Pastor Radak

The Devotion is from *Luke 10:1-12*. This was read at the Discernment Meeting earlier from "Dwelling in the Word."

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.'

I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A motion was called to approve the minutes from December 16, 2025. All were in favor.

Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence- Friendsgiving was postponed due to the weather, and will be rescheduled sometime this spring. The Facility Use Agreement was received from the Chamber of Commerce for renting the Gym and Kitchen for the Shad Fest April 26 & 27. A motion was called to approve the request from the COC. The motion was approved. Sue will get back to Amy at COC to let her know their request was approved. Yearly, our Highlands Presbytery requests that a "Necrology Report" be done for our Elders. None have passed away in 2024, and this information was emailed to the presbytery on 1/16/25. A letter was received from Pastor Stephanie Templin-Ashford from Thompson Memorial regarding the use of our Kitchen and Gym for the weekly luncheon that was previously done at Centenary Methodist in Lambertville. Sue was asked to reach out to Pastor Stephanie to see when she can come to a business meeting to discuss this. The Tyndale monthly publication is going digital as of January 2025. If there is a charge for this, we will no longer be getting the publication, but if there is no charge we will be. Sue will call to find this information out. Heather sent a 50% deposit to Martinez Landscaping regarding fixing the outside rock wall. This will most likely this will be done in the spring. More information to come. Our Worker's Comp. Policy was received for 2025-2026, and is on file in the Church Office. A motion was called to approve the 2024 Church Statistical Report. The motion was approved, and the report was sent to the Highlands Presbytery. Heather mentioned that the yearly Audit from Franklin Mutual Insurance has been completed. Karen asked that Sue send a message to the congregation to see who can help from 9 am-1 pm at upcoming Soup Sale on 3/1.

**Discernment Process**- The Session is continuing to review the "Turn the Page" documents that were handed out previously in looking for a new Pastor. The first meeting was done earlier today with Jeanne as our Facilitator. Those in attendance went through "Retreat #1 Gathering the Stories." One of the outcomes of this meeting was to see where God is calling us now as a church? Retreat 2 will be scheduled in the near future, and Retreats 3 & 4 will follow. If the congregation has a question regarding the Discernment Process, please reach out to a Session Member or Sue.

Pastor Search Committee- Jeanne suggested that we get together with Mt. Airy to come up with a position description together. What does the pastor do with each church? How would a pastor share their time with each church? Pension and benefits can be less when sharing a pastor. Sue was asked to reach out to Jack Williamson Mt. Airy's Clerk of Session to see when both Sessions can sit down together and talk about this. Jeanne also talked about how Elders can take classes to be put on the Pulpit Supply List. The class would include: Polity, Worship, and Pastoral Care. Elders would take an Internship after the classes, then would be Commissioned. Interested Elders should contact Steve Shussett the Stated Clerk for our Presbytery.

#### Calendar Highlights from February-April 2025

The Annual Congregational Meeting is on Sunday February 23<sup>rd</sup> after the worship service, with Installation Sunday on 3/5/25. There is a Soup Sale on Saturday March 1<sup>st</sup>. There is a Shrove Pancake Supper at Stockton Pres. on Tuesday March 4<sup>th</sup>. Ash Wednesday is on March 5<sup>th</sup>, and there is a service at Reaville Church in Ringoes-7:00 pm. The First Sunday in Lent is March 9<sup>th</sup>. The Session Business Meeting was moved from 3/17 to 3/10. Riverside Symphonia is in the Sanctuary on 4/4 & 4/5. The Concert is April 5<sup>th</sup>. The COC will be in the Gym starting 4/25. There will be 9:00 am Worship w/ no Sunday School on 4/27.

**Insurance Review-** We have insurance through Franklin Mutual, which is administrated by the Duryea Agency.

**Young Adult Time-** A message is given when the young adults are in church during the worship service.

**Accompanist/Music Director-** We will continue looking to fill the position. Our Accompanist Schedule is filled through the end of April.

**Spanish Ministry**- Joanne spoke about the Spanish Ministry, and they are meeting here on Sundays at 3:00 pm.

There will be a pastor coming to speak to the ministry from Cuba. Jeanne brought up that they will need to have Liability Insurance. And that our church First Presbyterian of Lambertville will need to be listed as the additional Insured. This will be looked into.

Joint Communion Services- This was discussed earlier in the Calendar section.

**July Joint Service at Holcombe-Jimison-** The committee will be getting together in March/April 2025 to discuss the service. In 2024 Russ Topping did the sermon. Karen and Phil will reach out to Stockton Pres. to see if their pastor would like to do the sermon this year. Phil mentioned that he would be available to give the sermon also.

Building and Grounds – Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Heather McIntyre/Don Pidcock

The **new technology** for the Livestream- Stephen McCloughan spoke at the Annual Meeting yesterday. He explained that the Wi-Fi works better for Facebook than YouTube, so at this time he will be Livestreaming the Sunday Service on Facebook. Comcast is going to get in touch with us to see when they can come to set up a new landline phone and other services, they have sent us a cell phone with the new plan. Heather will reach out to them to see when this will happen, and Sue will contact Comcast if necessary.

**Church Organ-** It will need regular tunings, but we will wait until next year for any major overhauls. Debbie the Church Treasurer will need to be contacted as well so she is included in anything major that needs to be done.

**Church Roof-** Is done, and all are happy with the outcome.

**Skating-** Resumed on January 3, 2025, and will conclude on March 14<sup>th</sup> for the season. There have been more youth attending.

**Martinez Landscaping-** They are continuing to service our yards, as well as take care of our sidewalks when it snows or is icy. Martinez will be fixing the stone wall in the spring.

Hallway in Church/Bathrooms/Front Door Issues- Hallway and front doors, will be taken care of in the spring. Joanne mentioned that the bathrooms need to be ventilated. Also, the pipes in the Church Kitchen where the gas stove is, are freezing. Don, Phil and Addie will be moving the stove to see where the pipes are. Jay Huff the local plumber will be called to help assist with this issue. More to follow on this.

Church Heaters/Monthly Fire Inspections- The heaters seem to be working in the Church proper, but the heater in Westminster House goes off from time to time. Garden State will be called to see if they can find out why this happens. Don has been doing the monthly checks on the smoke detectors and Exit Signs. Two smoke detectors had to be changed.

**Friends of Israel Conference**- This will be held on Saturday March 15<sup>th</sup> in Readington, NJ to talk about the Middle East. Don, Phil and Jim Gallagher will be attending.

**Pastor Search Committee-** Sue was asked to send the resume for the pastor to Princeton Seminary once Session was able to look it over and ok it. The resume was sent to Princeton on 2/13/25. Sue is waiting for a response and will let the Session know when this happens.

**Report of Commissioner to the Presbytery-** Phil attended the Zoom meeting in November, and he will be Zooming into the upcoming meeting on March 11, 2025.

**Church Safe-** This holds the church's historical documents. Heather will look into getting the combination for the safe.
