Dear church family,

As the days get shorter this time of year, sometimes our moods become less bright. But into this increased darkness shines the hope of Advent – "coming" – the coming of Christ!

In our worship life, we symbolize Christ's coming light by lighting candles on our Advent wreath. The church has taken ancient practices – lighting fires during the winter season and praying for the return of light – and re-centered them on Jesus Christ, the world's true light, who's able to overcome darkness everywhere.

As more candles are lit each week, reaching a climax with the Christ Candle on Christmas Eve, we have a powerful symbol of the growing light of Christ in our world today. And we're reminded of our hope for his coming again in all fullness on that great future day when he'll completely eliminate darkness forever.

During the four Sundays of Advent, we'll be lighting candles that represent hope, peace, joy, and love. I leave you with the Lord's promise of hope, which directs our attention to the Lord himself coming to us on that first Christmas day.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah.

In those days and at that time I will cause

a righteous Branch to spring up for David;

and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.

In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety.

And this is the name by which it will be called:

"The Lord is our righteousness."



Session Business Meeting and opened the meeting in prayer.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box – Karen Thatcher

Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the September 20, 2021 Business Meeting Minutes; Rich Hopkins moved to accept the Minutes as writing and all were in

Worship and music/Church Life - Karen Thatcher

Sight & Sound/Bird-n-Hand Contract – the contract has been signed and submitted for the David Performance October 15, 2022. 50 tickets. Fundraising has been set for a Soup Sale during the Basketball Season. Heather Pursell (and committee) will be in charge of making the soup; as Donna Zambella and Karen Thatcher will make contacts for those to sell the soup. We are hopeful that Lambertville will be back on track for the Spring 2022 Shad Fest for hot dog sales. Insurance — The Accident policy has been renewed and paid.

Accompanist Search Committee – The job description for Accompanist/Music Director has been posted in a few places. The Committee will meet on Sunday 10/24/2021 to discuss and move forward to make contacts from the substitute list for January, February 2022. The Committee is prayerful that God has a plan. Children's Time/Sermon – We are grateful for those who have come forward to be part of this time in our Worship Service.

Care & Share – Karen Thatcher and Russ Topping will host the first C&S on Communion Sunday November 7. The plan is to have C&S each Communion Sunday. We are keeping it simple, those interested please see Karen.

Greeting/Greeter List – Connie Fisher has reached out and contacted a few of our church members and has a schedule for the rest of 2021. We are grateful to

Connie for her heart in this matter and those who have come forward to be a Greeter.

Buildings and Grounds – Pat Durborow

Pat advised that the donation clothes that are left in the gym will be gone by the end of October and Pat will contact a company that will come and collect the bagged clothes. The gates to the cemetery and garden will be locked during Halloween weekend. Roller Skating and Friday Night Hang will resume on November 19 and we will follow the CDC Guidelines. We are grateful for the those who volunteer their time to continue our outreach ministries.

Budget and Finance - Rich Hopkins/Heather McIntyre

Rich went over the year-to-date summary and noted that the plate offering is down as expected due to low number of attendances. The Lowell Hunter Estate is still in audit by the State of New Jersey and Rich will keep Session posted to updates. Heather advised that she emailed the Finance paperwork to all Session Members and reviewed the Morgan Stanley Account and the Zoom Attendance with Session.

Sunday School/Youth Group - Carol Griffiths

Carol reviewed with Session that the Children's Sunday School will begin on November 7. Carol will contact the Sunday School Teachers as reminder to contact the children by phone call or email. Sue will send out an email to the Church Family as well. Regarding the Junior Deacons, Carol will contact the Deacons for a list of Junior Deacons and ask that they come prepared to discuss this at the Joint Meeting.

Moderator Time – Rev. Dan Dorrow

The three questions posed to the Session by Pastor Dan – 'What to let go of? What to hold on to? What's next?' The Session members discussed, shared thoughts and prayed over the questions Pastor Dan posed to them at the last meeting. Pastor Dan took notes and will send this list to all Session to review and for future discussion. We thank God that He placed our church in the center of Lambertville and has seen fit to keep our doors open to all. We know that the

Lord will guide us as we move through the COVID Pandemic and toward our Church's mission.
