Help Wanted for Rollerskating!!

The Lambertville Presbyterian Church's Friday Night Roller Skating program is seeking an individual to be director(s) of roller skating starting in November 2020. Cooie and Desre Pidcock are retiring from that position as of April 2020 after 20 years of service.

On Friday night during the winter months children in sixth grade and under attend free skating from 6pm to 8pm in our church's activity building. As this is a mission outreach of the church, a short (5 to 10 minute) Bible study lesson is given for the children around 7 pm.

The director will need to start about 5:40 pm by setting up chairs, music, lights, and checking bathrooms. While the children are there, the director will oversee the activities to ensure safety and can introduce "corner games" and other variations that the children enjoy. After the Bible lesson, children are invited to participate in races, in which they compete against others in their grade level (for example, first and second grade boys or fifth and sixth grade girls). The races are very popular among the children. It is necessary to have some volunteer assistants, as the director must be focused on the skating area, rather than the snack table. When the skating session ends, the director will have to do general clean-up of the floor, seating areas and bathrooms so the gym can be used for the "teen hang" program that begins at 8 pm.

If you enjoy meeting people and having fun with kids, this is the position for you! Friday Night Skating is in its 63rd year and going strong. Please contact Sue at the church office or contact Cooie for more information.



Devotion-Rich Hopkins

The Devotion was based on 1 Timothy 6:20 and 2 Timothy 1:14. In both letters, Paul tells Timothy to "guard what has been entrusted to his care." The question is, guard what?

The answer is found in both letters-it's "truth."

2 Timothy 2:15 calls scripture "the word of truth." In 2 Timothy Paul describes it as "opposing ideas falsely called knowledge. " In 2 Timothy, Paul says we need to utilize the Holy Spirit to help us, and in 2 Timothy 2:2 we need to pass it on. It's quite a responsibility. Guard the truth above all things, study the word of truth.

Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the minutes from the December 22, 2019 Session Business Meeting. A **motion** was called to accept the Minutes as written. All were in favor. Rich will contact Pastor Amy Lincoln from Flemington Presbyterian Church to see if she would be able to give our member who is in the Hunterdon Care Center, communion. It might be possible for any of our Elders to give our member communion as well, as it it allowed by the PCUSA.

Building and Grounds- Pat Durborow

Kitchen updates- The gas stove isn't being removed until after Easter. Pat will consult with Grace Reading before buying a new stove. There will be a general cleaning of the kitchen. Reiner Heating- Heather McIntyre has been looking into our contract with Reiner and the issues we have been having with the furnaces. Our furnaces were installed in 2014. We received a second opinion from Harris Comfort to see if they can fix the furnace at a lower cost. Heather will possibly be sending Reiner a letter regarding our Service Contract with them.

Budget and Finance-Rich Hopkins/Heather McIntyre

Banking Summary presented year to date. Weekly Plate Spreadsheet was given out, from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 and 1/1/20-1/20/20. This was reviewed by Heather to the Session. **The 2020 Budget** was Approved at the December Business Meeting.

Youth Group Ministry/Sunday School- Carol Griffiths/Pat Durborow

Junior Deacons-Carol and Pat are to attend the Deacons Meeting next Monday January 27th, to see if there is an interest for the Junior Deacon program and to see if the Senior Deacons will be able oversee the Junior Deacons. The program should start simple and build.

Pat mentioned that changing the Sunday School back to 9:00 am seems to help, and that Sunday School is going well.

Moderator Time-Rev. Byron Leasure

Rev. Leasure read from the **Book of Order: W3.0414 (3rd paragraph)** regarding Communion after church (extended service of communion) and not to make it social, but to make it an extended part of worship, and how Session guides this process.

New Brunswick Presbytery-Rev. Leasure talked about the Presbytery and to have a former Moderator from the New Brunswick Presbytery to come and speak with our Session at a future Business Meeting. He will talk with our Liaison David Redman and meet with the Presbytery regarding this before the next Session Business Meeting.

Session Members discussed and shared praises and concerns.

Holy Communion- Was celebrated on January 5, 2020 and was led by Rev. Byron Leasure. Recognition of a former Pastor- A plaque was discussed for Dr. Henry and putting the plaque in the gym, since he was a big part in having our gym built in 1957. More information to follow. Continuing of Education- Elders are encouraged to continue in and share the word of God through reading.

His Word, devotions, prayer and to be involved in education. Elders-Are to continue Pastoral Care.

Prayer Meetings- Will continue the first Monday of each month with members sharing His Word through readings, thoughts, scripture and prayer. If weather is an issue or for personal reasons keep session members from attending, the session resolved to pray wherever they are during the 7 o'clock hour.
