January Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Devotion – Rich Hopkins

Psalm 73 was written by a person named Asaph. He voices a complaint I've often had over the years: why do the arrogant and wicked prosper while the Godly suffer? Asaph very clearly enumerates all of his complaints in verses 2 through 15.

Asaph's conclusion? In spite of all of the apparent worldly wealth and health of the wicked, he writes in verses 23 and 24, "Yet I am always with you, you hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory." That ought to be our focus as believers. And that ought to be our focus as we make try to make disciples in Lambertville.

<u>Around the Room -</u> The Elders, Dan and myself went around the room and shared our concerns.

Dan closed this section with prayer of what was discussed.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the minutes from December 20, 2021 at tonight's meeting. A **motion** was called to accept the Minutes as written. All were in favor. The approved Minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter.

Calendar Highlights from February-April 2022:

Communion will be held on Sundays 2/6, 3/6 and 4/3. Skating and Friday Night Hang will continue on Friday Nights until mid-March. The Soup Sales to fundraise to see *David* at Sight & Sound will be held on Saturday's during basketball, 2/12, 2/26 and 3/5. The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday February 27, 2022 after the Church Service and the Ordination/Installation will be during the worship service on Sunday March 6, 2022. Dan will be away the week of February 14th. Ash Wednesday is 3/2/22, and Dan is speaking to Rev. Brad Morgan from Mt. Airy to set up Lenten Services. More information to follow. The last Saturday for LBL is 3/19. The March & April Session Prayer and Business meeting dates were given. Palm Sunday is April 10th and Easter is April 17th. Shad Fest is most likely going to be coming towards the end of April, more information to follow on that as well.

Book of Registry- Grace Hendricks passed away on 1/9/22, and this was noted to Session.

Worship and Music/Church Life - Karen Thatcher

We are getting 50 tickets to Sight & Sound for October 15, 2022. Karen asked Sue to do a sign-up sheet for the downstairs hallway, to keep a headcount. It looks at this time to be \$100.00 per person, but with the fundraising it may be less. The bus is extra. More details of the trip as it gets closer. The church is holding Soup Sales on some Saturdays during basketball. The sale from 1/8/22, made \$600.00. The Presbytery is looking for our church to enhance our Sexual Misconduct Policy. Karen is working on getting a quote from the Duryea Agency to see what coverage that we'll need to carry. Once she has obtained this information, she will send the info. to Session.

The Accompanist position is being worked on with Karen as well as members of our congregation.

We have 2 possible people that may be interested. Hilary was asked to possibly become permanent in the Accompanist position, she said that she would pray on this. Dan suggested to structure the position for Hilary. He will email Karen regarding this. George will be playing for us on 2/6 and 2/27, and Emily will play for us on 2/13 and 2/20.

Building and Grounds - Pat Durborow/Don Pidcock

Pat spoke about Martinez Landscaping and how they cleaned up the garden area and the branches of the tree by Dan's office window. They will also be taking care of our snow needs. Skating and Friday Night Hang, have been happening, but it's been week by week. Russ, Pat and Terry Peck have been there for FNH. The heat has been working well in all about the church. The leak in the Gym has been fixed. Don Pidcock spoke with Craig Reading regarding books of history that he has, and they belong to the church. Session discussed what should be done with the books. Rich will talk to Craig about having the books come back to the church. A letter will be drafted and given to Craig regarding the books. Session will talk more about this at the next business meeting. No information on the first floor bathroom as of yet.

Children's Time Sermon, Dan was asked to take the month of March, he said that he would pray on that.

Budget and Finance - Rich Hopkins

The Year-to Date Summary was not addressed at tonight's meeting. The summary and Zoom information will be sent in by Heather at a later date. There is no new information on the Lowell Hunter Estate. Rich will keep Session posted on any updates of the estate. Updates on the Boy Scouts and what is going on with the legal issues were given as well. We are waiting to see what happens legally in other places. The annual Boy Scout Sunday is being worked on for February by Rich and Brian Claus, the leader of Troop 49.

There was a **motion** to approve the 2022 Church Budget, as the information that was presented by the Budget Committee. A three percent increase was recommended for paid staff as well, and was accepted as part of the budget. The 2022 Budget was approved by Session.

Sunday School/Junior Deacons - Carol Griffiths/Don Pidcock

Carol spoke about the Junior Deacons, and there are two families that are interested in the Jr. Deacons at this time. The McCloughan and Dudick families were mentioned, but this is still a work in progress. Don talked about the Sunday School, and how we will need more children for enrollment, and we'll need to have the parents stay to have at least 2 adults for each class. There aren't any children at this time in grades 7-9 Sunday School. The high school teens usually attend the Adult Sunday School. Pat added that Covid has affected a lot of the local schools.

Moderator Time - Rev. Dan Dorrow

Dan mentions that he would like to be away on Sunday 2/20 and 6/26/22, and he also mentions to possibly use the "Pulpit Supply List" while he is away. Karen suggested that we could have on 2/20 "What Jesus Means to Me." Sunday, which Session thought was a good idea. Dan would like this to be on going at the Session meetings: 1. What should we let go of? 2. What should we keep? 3. What's next? These questions may help frame our thinking. Session went around the room and these were some of the suggestions for our long-term vision: Do we wait for the pandemic to be over, or do we go on and try and to bring in new people, but we have seen more new faces recently. Our doors are open, and the Presbytery should bring in more people, or use some type of media to reach people. Maybe not try to change things too much, because of the pandemic. Since these are troubled times, the church should do more outreach. Friday Night Hang was discussed on how to improve attendance, we need to do something, but not quite sure what. Also, to possibly do an Adult Bible Study on some evening. Dan said that since we still are in the pandemic, we should not rush into new plans to reach out to our community, but now is the time to prayerfully consider how we may function in the next 1-3 years. To listen to God and each other, and to all pray for more pastoral involvement.
