On May 19, 2024, we will celebrate the end of the Easter season with Pentecost, which occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and HIS ascension into heaven. After Jesus's resurrection he lived 40 days showing himself to many people convincing them that He was alive.

Before Jesus ascended, he promised to send to his disciples an advocate, the Holy Spirit, to give them understanding and direction. Ten days after His ascension Pentecost came and was the fulfillment of that promise, making it one of the most important days of the year as it celebrates the beginning of the church and its mission to the world.

The Bible describes the coming of the Holy Spirit as a sound like a "strong, driving" wind filling the room, and tongues "as of fire" coming to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so they could understand each other. The Holy Spirit came on the 50th day (hence the name Pentecost (Greek) meaning 50) which also coincided with the Jewish holiday called the Feast of Weeks or the Feast of Harvest. These Feast caused many Jewish people from different parts of the world to be assembled in Jerusalem. So as the disciples spoke to the assembled people they heard them speaking in many different native tongues. All were amazed.

We also today should be amazed as God is speaking to all nations in their native tongues. He is continually reaching out to all those who are poor, needy, helpless and wanting. That is just one reason of many that God has ordained each one of us with The Holy Spirit so that we can reach out to any and all to share Gods love. We may not have received the Holy Spirit with flames of fire and sounds of wind but we did received it as Jesus promised it to us all. John 14-16


• Hebrews 10:23-25

God loves you and wants you to experience peace and eternal life—abundant and eternal. The Bible says:

<u>Around the Room -</u> The Elders, Linda and myself went around the room and shared our concerns. Linda will take the prayers home and pray for those concerns, then closed this section in prayer.

Moderator Time - Pastor Jeanne Radek and Pastor Mike Atzert

Jeanne started with steps on how to look for a new pastor, since Dan Dorrow has been gone for over a year. She mentioned a process called "Turn the Page" this is a series of retreats that the Presbytery would help our session with. There are usually 3 steps. Step 1. – Discernment or what's the next chapter? In what direction is God leading us to find a pastor. Step 2. – What has the Session learned from step 1, and where is God calling us? Step 3.- What is God calling us to do, as our session would be setting up and asking the congregation, what kind of leader do we need? This step would also include writing up a vocation statement, or who would have the call to become be our pastor. Jeanne also talked about possibly sharing a pastor with Mt. Airy or Titusville, and there were many steps that were discussed. She at this point asked session to give their ideas on what we are looking for in a pastor. Some ideas were: If we did get a full-time pastor, the insurance would go up considerably. Other churches are sharing pastors. Mike asked what our church has already in place to reach the community-skating was mentioned. Jeanne mentioned that without pastoral leadership, that we are "stalled." We should look at where is God leading us now? Some churches in our Presbytery have small groups but are thriving. Heather asked how we get the retreats started. Jeanne asked that we do the retreats in person, and we'll need a Trained Facilitator that our church would need to pay. We can call Mike to obtain a Facilitator. The *Turn the Page* information is on the Presbytery Website, and session will look into this soon. Pastor Linda said that we should "think out of the box", and to put together a wish list, and what would work for our church. Also, where do we see our church in 2-5 years from now? If there are any questions in our search, we should reach out to Pastor Jeanne and Pastor Mike. Jeanne and Mike have left the Session Meeting at this time.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A **motion** was called to approve the minutes from February 19, 2024. All were in favor.

Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence- We have received a letter from the New Life Riders (Terry Slemmer) thanking us for the toy drive we held in October 2023 to benefit the children of inmates at the Edna Mahon Correctional Facility. Sue gave the letter to Joanne to bring to Missions. An email was received from FM Global to inspect the church boilers for our insurance company, Franklin Mutual. This will be done later in the month. The March Pulpit Supply List was given out. Sue received the updated COI from the Lambertville Chamber of Commerce for the upcoming Shad Fest.

Calendar Highlights from April-June 2024

Communion is scheduled for 4/14, 5/26. 6/2 will be a joint Communion Sunday with Mt. Airy at Mt. Airy. All dates are with Peter Gregory. See the bulletins for who is scheduled to give the upcoming Sermons and our Accompanists. The Ladies' Bible Study will be continuing on Wednesdays. LPS is continuing with the use of our gym. Riverside Symphonia will be using our Sanctuary 4/12 and 13. We will be having Worship Service here at 9:00 am on 4/21-Shad Fest weekend. The Bell Choir will be performing outside either Saturday or Sunday at Shad Fest. The COC will be in the Gym 4/19-4/21 for their Poster Auction. On Thursday May 2nd is the National Day of Prayer. Sue will order a poster and bookmarks for the day, and our Sanctuary will be open for prayer.

Pat will get carnations for the women on Mother's Day. Sue contacted Gabe Stephens from SHR and some of the Marching Band will come and play special music for our 5/26 service. Our last service for 10:30 am until September is June 2nd. We will be starting the summer schedule on Sunday June 9th, and the worship service will be at 9:30 am. The last Session Business Meeting until September is Monday June 10th. There are no Session Business Meeting during July and August. More on the summer prayer meetings to follow. Pastor Linda mentioned that if we are looking for musicians, that we should join the Liturgical Musicians page on Facebook. They get a lot of posting on this page, and we should post how much our stipend is. We may be able to find more substitute accompanists this way. Karen and Sue will be working on this.

Book of Registry- Was updated with the Installation/Ordination of Church Elders and Deacons on 3/5/24. Don Pidcock-Installed Elder and Karen Thatcher Installed Elder. Jen Chernoski and LaNelle Gallagher Installed Deacon. Dana Garrenger Ordained Deacon. All terms will end in February 2027.

Front Page for Upcoming Newsletters-Elders were asked to take a month to do a front page for the newsletters. The list was completed up to December 2024.

Worship and Music/Church Life – Joanne DiBlasi/Karen Thatcher

Insurance Review- Karen will reach out to Jean Ring our new insurance rep. from the Duryea Agency. We are still finding issues in the church regarding the lightning strike in June 2023, and will continue working with Duryea and Decker and Associates to have the issues resolved.

Young Adult Time- Phil is scheduled for 3/24 and Don for 3/31. Joanne will ask for 4/7. The Young Adults will be coming up the aisle and bringing the palms during the singing of "The Palms" on Palm Sunday.

Soup Sale and other Fund Raisers- The soup sale is done at this time. The sales have made over \$3000. We will be selling the remainder of the soup after church for half price. What doesn't sell could possibly be given to Fisherman's Mark.

Accompanist/Music Director- Our resume for the Accompanist/Music Director is still active on "Call Finders" the Presbytery Website. Pastor Linda discussed with session earlier about the possibility of finding substitute accompanists on Facebook.

Spanish Ministry- Joanne has been in touch with Francesca regarding to have the Spanish Community to rent our Chapel on Wednesday nights. This would first be on a trial basis, and Joanne would be here for them. Phil also said he would be available to be here in the beginning if necessary. Linda said that this was exciting. A **motion** was brought to have the Spanish Ministry temporarily use our Chapel to see how it goes on Wednesday nights. They can also use the Adult Sunday School Room. The **motion** was approved, and all were in favor. Joanne will get back to Francesca to let her know she can use these rooms in the church.

Nominating Committee 2024- Is over at this time.

<u>Building and Grounds</u> – Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Heather McIntyre/Don Pidcock

The **new technology** for the Livestream is up and running. Phil suggested that we buy 2 or 4 more microphones for the front of the church, so that the organ and handbell choir can be heard better. The quality is much better with the new cameras.

Martinez Landscaping- Not discussed at this time.

Church Roof- This is ongoing, and Heather and Phil will narrow it down to one contractor. Painting will be done to the church at a different time. Phil talked about the cemetery and how the scaffolding will be placed over the stones to protect them. Scaffolding will most likely be put on both sides of the church.

Skating and Friday Night Hang – Not discussed at this time.

Church Organ- Will be addressed after the work on the church roof is completed.

Hallway in Church/Bathrooms- Not discussed tonight.

Heating in the Church/Westminster House- The 2nd furnace in the church, the parts have been replaced. Garden State has been servicing all of our furnaces, but they need to come back to do diagnostic checks on the furnace at Westminster House and the furnace behind the nursery to make sure that furnace isn't affecting the SDG alarm.

Steeple Bell- An Art Historian came by the church and spoke to Joanne regarding if there is any graffiti in the church steeple bell. His name was Greg Huber. He gave Joanne his contact information, and she turned that over to Don. Maybe possibly to put a ladder up in the steeple to look at the bell to see if there is graffiti. Joanne will reach out to Greg and let him know she passed the information on to Don so he can get in touch with him.

Budget and Finance – Heather McIntyre

Our Year-to-Date Summary was given out and was discussed, from 1/1-3/18/24, and we are under in our Plate by \$1368.82 and Heather reviewed this with Session. The Workman's Comp. Audit has been done.

Lowell Hunter Estate- No updates at this time.

Boy Scouts- No updates at this time regarding the litigation. The Boy Scouts did clean up the skating closet.

Usage of the Gym for LPS during the 2023-2024 School Year- We have been paid up to date for the use of the gym.

AED Equipment- Heather discussed the AED, and it is still beeping at times, so we do have new pads to try for the AED to see if the beeping will stop.

Heating System Energy Assessment- On pause for now, but Heather will keep session updated with any new developments.

Grants- On hold at this time.

<u>Sunday School/Junior Deacons</u> – Joanne DiBlasi/Don Pidcock

Sunday School- Is still continuing. Don will let Sue know when Sunday School will be ending for the summer.

Junior Deacons- They are participating in the church services.

Missions – Joanne DiBlasi

Mission checks will be going out this month to those missions that our church supports.
