
"From the Office"

In a building over 160 years old you witness a lot of history. In the walls of First Presbyterian is the history of our nation and service. The church was a meeting and rally location in the days after Fort Sumter and the start of the Civil War for the formation of the Union regiments on both sides of the water. 10th PA. Volunteer rifles out of New Hope and 14th NJ infantry. In WW1 many victory bond rallies were held in the church, given that for a period of time it was the largest public meeting space between Philadelphia and New York City. The USO would host many canteen services out of the old basement for troops traveling to the Philadelphia and transport to Europe during WW2. The point being the church has been part of, and witness to national and world history.

As you enter and leave the sanctuary you will see the over 50 names of those who in our church and community, who have served our nation in both war and peace on our memorial plaque. Many of those names represent the families who have been part of this Faith Community going back to 1816. This Veterans Day 2020, yes we continue to face the challenges of the Pandemic and the changes brought. But we also remember those in out faith and families who have stood tall in our nations call to service and those who have paid the price for us.

The cost of Freedom is never free, but at times calls for the blood, sweat and dedication of those who have worn the Uniform and those whose services is one of Duty, Honor, Faith and Service. God bless them all

In these verses we see that God knows the depth and true intentions of our hearts and only He can clean them, prioritize them and soften them.


* Please Read Matthew 12: 33 to 37, Matthew 15: 16 to 20 and Luke 6:45

Welcome: Reverend Dorrow, declaring a quorum, welcomed all to the September Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Devotion- Russ Topping

Russ read excerpts and discusses Max Lucado's book *He Still Moves Stones*, which included Jesus and the Man at the Well. As well as; Jonah in the belly of the Whale, Daniel in the Lion's Den. Barabbas the thief was talked about how he was going to die, but someone took his place, and that someone was Jesus. The time to cry never comes. Jesus tells us to stand and not to worry, to take up his word and that he is with us.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box- Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the minutes from the July 20, 2020 Session Business Meeting.

A **motion** was called to accept the Minutes as written. All were in favor. The approved Minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter. A **motion** was brought to approve the Called Session Business Meeting and Communion Dates for 2021. All were in favor. The approved schedule will be listed as "Addendum A" and will be filed in the Book of Minutes.

Sue discussed a price quote with Session, to get a newer "used" copy machine from Prior-Nami. A **motion** was brought forth to buy the copier and retain the maintenance contract with Prior-Nami. All were in favor. Sue will contact Prior-Nami to get the newer copy machine and roll over our current maintenance contract. The older copy machine will be returned to Prior-Nami. Session also discussed SDG and the ongoing problems with the alarm system. It keeps going off and it hasn't been fixed properly. Heather McIntyre will follow up with SDG regarding this issue.

Extended Communion Training- Pastor Dorrow will look over the information that he received. Pastor will send the information out to Session before the next business meeting to be looked over, and to be discussed then.

Calendar Highlights from October-December 2020:

Communion did restart on August 30, 2020, and it was done during in person worship. The Deacons will be hosting a clothing drive during the month of October to benefit the Rescue Mission of Trenton. The scheduled pick-up for the clothing drive is Sunday October 18th. The Boy Scouts are slotted in the 7:00 pm time on Monday evenings. They will most likely be meeting in our gym again soon. The gates of the church will be locked from Friday October 30th until Sunday November 1st. Phil McCloughan would like to do a special presentation the Sunday before Veteran's Day. He will need to contact Pastor Dan to discuss. The trip to Sight and Sound is on Saturday November 14, 2020 to see Queen Esther. As of now, the trip is still on. The Lambertville Basketball League is going to start on Saturday December 5, 2020 and will be running until March 2021. Jim Troutman is still our point of contact. Plans for the season and Christmas Eve are being discussed. More information to come soon.

Worship and Music-Joanne DiBlasi

Joanne will be restarting to send out a weekly email to all for bible study. She talked to the ladies of the church, and they are looking to have their bible study on Wednesday afternoons at 3:00 pm, here at our church. The date when to start is being determined. There is no Sunday School or Care & Share until further notice. Rich and Becky will be away on Sunday October 11th. Sue will call Emily Atzert to see if she will be able to substitute.

Operation Christmas Child- We will be collecting for Operation Christmas Child this year. The boxes and pamphlets have been ordered. and will be given out to the congregation when they are received.

Building and Grounds- Pat Durborow/Heather McIntyre/Don Pidcock

Don spoke about the church bell tower and made our songs in the tower from two to one. Also, he will be giving a Moment for Mission on Sunday September 27th. He will be speaking about one of he and Desre's ministries-"Blessing of Hope."

Church Kitchen- Pat Durborow is in the process of getting information on updating the church kitchen. The Iron Fence, this will be fixed/painted before the frost sets in. the Pidcock Family Stone was not discussed. The Plaque for Dr. Henry, Don Pidcock will take a walk through the Gym to see where the plaque may be placed. Security for Westminster House, front door, Pat has the buzzer security system for the front door and it will be installed soon.

Pat Durborow yielded her time to Heather McIntyre so that she could discuss the **façade/ dental work** of the church's roof, as well as the chimney. Gutters also need to be cleaned. The chimney has to be removed and that the dental work will be taken care of by Nate McIntyre. It was determined that the church roof is 29 years old and will need to be replaced. This is a large job, and Heather will look into the price of a new roof. Heather also discussed our furnace system and that we are getting estimates from local companies to obtain a maintenance contract.

Budget and Finance-Rich Hopkins/Heather McIntyre

Our Year to Date Summary is that we are down \$11,192.17 as of September 21, 2020 This was reviewed by Heather to the Session. Heather is looking into getting our investment checks sent from Morgan Stanley to our our account electronically to pay bills, so no more paper checks will have to be deposited.

Sunday School/Junior Deacons- Carol Griffiths

Sunday School- Pastor Dan asked if Carol and Mark Dudick could either call or email the parents of our Sunday School children how they are doing, since there is no Sunday School. Maybe possibly to have a Children's Sermon Time during the worship service. Carol will also get in touch with Danielle Griffiths regarding the youth in our church. Joanne DiBlasi would like to encourage our youth during this time of the pandemic.

Junior Deacons- Carol spoke about the Junior Deacons and a list was given to Pastor Dan. At this time the Junior Deacons are on hold.

Moderator Time-Rev. Dan Dorrow

Pastor Dan asked if we could start our Sunday Service with a worship and sing at 10:20 am. To call it "Prelude Worship." This would be put in the bulletin to let the congregation know what to expect. He also asked if an Elder can be put in charge, so that we can meditate in the Sanctuary, and have conversations when everyone first comes into the church or first floor. Pastor asked if he could have plexiglass put in front of the pulpit, so a mask wouldn't be necessary. This is in relation to Covid-19 safety issues. He would pray about this.

There is going to be a Prayer March in Washington, D.C. on September 26, 2020. We are looking to have a service at our church to coincide with the march, to be outside in the Westminster Garden, where safety precautions will take place. It was discussed that Karen Thatcher will be picking the hymns for the service on September 26th. Pastor would also like to continue to greet outside after the worship service. Feedback from Session is always welcome.

Session Members discussed and shared praises and concerns.

Holy Communion- Was held on Sunday September 13, 2020.

Videotaping our worship service- Pat Durborow asked if we could videotape our service, and possibly to put on Social Media. This could be another was of reaching out to our community. All were asked to pray about this.

Continuing of Education- Elders are encouraged to continue in and share the word of God through reading His Word, devotions, prayer and to be involved in education.

Elders-Are to continue Pastoral Care as needed.

Prayer Meetings- Will continue the first Monday of each month with members sharing His Word through readings, thoughts, scripture and prayer. If weather is an issue or for personal reasons keep session members from attending, the session resolved to pray wherever they are during the 7 o'clock hour.

Session Devotion Rotation-For the October Meeting is: Joanne DiBlasi, followed by Mark Dudick, Pat Durborow and Carol Griffiths
