Dear church family,

Moving into the Fall season, as our children and young adults return to school, I'm thinking about Jesus's love for children. He said,

"Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them. (Mark 10:14b-16)

And I'm thinking about Elise Stratuik's baptism a few weeks ago. Her parents and all of us, as her church family, promised to guide and nurture Elise, to teach her about God's Son, Jesus, who welcomes every child. Her baptism, and our baptisms, are signs that God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – reaches out to each of us and calls us by name, just as we see Jesus reach out, take up, and bless the little children.

Proverbs 18:4


"Wise words are like deep waters; wisdom flows from the wise like a bubbling brook!"

Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Devotion- Don Pidcock

Don told the modern parable of the "Three Trees" which told of dreams and hopes of each tree and what they wanted for themselves. The first tree wanted to be a treasure chest, and the second tree wanted to be a mighty ship. The third tree wanted to just to stay in the forest, and she wanted to get big and tall and point to Heaven and God. Well, three carpenters came to the forest and each one cut a tree down. The first tree was made into a feedbox, the second tree was made into a small fishing boat and the third tree was made into strong beams, and taken to a lumberyard. At this time, the 3 trees almost forgot about their dreams. The feedbox ended up in a barn. A young woman put her newborn baby in the feedbox, and at that moment, the first tree they knew that she was holding someone very important. Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the minutes from May 17, 2021 at tonight's meeting. A **motion** was called to accept the Minutes as written. All were in favor. The approved Minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter.

Mail Box-

The church received the Retail Food License Certificate valid from June 1, 2021-May 31, 2022, from the city. The license will be posted in the church kitchen. A **motion** for the Office Copy Machine service contract from Prior-Nami, for June 2021-June 2022 to be renewed was called and accepted. A copy of the contract is on file in the church office.

Calendar Highlights from June-September 2021:

For June, we move to the 9:20/9:30 am worship times on the 13th. The last scheduled Session Business Meeting is Monday June 21. There are no business meetings scheduled for July and August. There is a Session Prayer meeting scheduled via Zoom for Monday July 5th and Monday August 2nd at 7:00 pm. Dan will be out of the Office the week of August 8th. We will need someone to preach on that Sunday 8/8. September, we go back to our fall worship schedule on Sunday September 12th. We are also re-starting Sunday School on that Sunday at 9:00 am. Prelude Worship will start at 10:20, and with Worship at 10:30 am. Our September Business Meeting will be at Westminster House on 9/20 at 7:00 pm. Dan is out of the Office starting September 24 and he will be returning on October 8. Dan asked about 9/11, Patriot Day, and we explained that services for that date vary from year to year.

Book of Registry- The Session was made aware that Matt and Lauren Wiley transferred to Pennington Presbyterian Church from Lambertville Presbyterian, Lambertville NJ on May 24, 2021. A transfer certificate was obtained and is on file in the church office.

Worship and Music/Church Life-Karen Thatcher

Karen spoke with Bird and Hand Buffet to have after the trip to Sight & Sound in October of 2022 to see the production of *David*. A sign up will be put in the church when the date gets closer to see who is interested in attending. We also have a credit on our account from S&S which we can use for the 2022 show. Karen also spoke about possibly doing a couple of fundraisers to defray the cost. An idea of a soup sale during this upcoming LBL season and selling hot dogs at Shad Fest. We'll wait and see what the fundraisers bring in before we know how much to charge per person. The Pianist position is being worked on, Karen thanked Donna Zambella and Sue McCloughan in getting the job description out. Rich suggested in sending the job description to Carin University Music Department. Karen spoke with other pianists in the area and it will be sent to them, to go to their contacts. Karen asked to keep this in prayer. The Children's Time will be continued during the summer months. The Joint Service will be at Holcombe-Jimison Farm on Sunday July 4th at 10:00 am. A donation from each church will be made to the farm. The Handbell Choir will be playing this year. It is going to be a catered lunch, but some churches will be providing their own.

Communion on August 1st- Russ Topping brought up that we should go back to doing communion the way it was done before. The bread and juice being handed out to the congregation in the pews. With the Elders serving and the Deacons to get it ready. This should be happening on 8/1/21.

During worship on July 31st- Nick Armano will be talking to the congregation about his future endeavors, and Rich will be giving him a scholarship check. Nick's name will be included on the plaque that is outside of the Sanctuary, as with the past scholarship recipients.

Building and Grounds- Don Pidcock

The Façade will be worked on soon. Addie made a bid to work on the kitchen, which was accepted, so Addie and Joanne to organize signs, cleaning and painting the walls, the cabinets are not being painted at this time. Looking at the lighting, and fixing if needed. To replace the floor is a separate bid. Don will get in touch with Heather McIntyre to see what else should be done with the kitchen. The plaque for Dr. Henry, Don will research a price and get back to Session. Rich and Karen gave ideas who we could contact to do the plaque. An example would be Crown Trophy.

Budget and Finance-Rich Hopkins

Rich went over the Year-to Date Summary from 1/1-6/21/21, we are down \$1925.68 in our plate offering. Our investments are going well, the PPP loan, is a grant if we use it for our payroll. This is to offset our budget. The Lowell Hunter Estate is still being worked on by the State of NJ. Dan's contract for June 2021-2022 is being renewed by Session. Rich will get Dan's new contract to him. The Boy Scouts are not meeting here for now, but Rich will contact Brian Claus, the leader of Troop 49, to see when they may be coming back to use the church gym. Rich will keep Sue in the office informed of when they may be returning.

Sunday School/Youth Group-Don Pidcock

The Sunday School for all ages will be resuming at 9:00 am on September 12. The individual Sunday School classes have not been established as yet. The possible teachers for this year are: Heather P., Jen, Suzanne, Danielle, LaNelle, and Don. Rich will be teaching the Adult Sunday School. More information to come soon. Dan will be doing a letter to the Sunday School children. We usually have 28+ children attending Sunday School. Karen talked about the music for the children's Sunday School. Maybe have the Crystal Bells play in church, children's hymns. Stephen will be asked to play piano for the beginning of children's Sunday School. Karen is also going to ask Pat D., if she will be teaching this year.

We thanked Karen for her voice and song, this past Sunday.

Moderator Time-Rev. Dan Dorrow

Dan asked how we can reach beyond our walls, a vision of how can this be done? The best way to bring people in? Some ideas were, a personal invitation to parents of our Sunday School children to come to church. Being involved in the community, Shad Fest, bake sales, before Thanksgiving soup sales, possible roller skating, to name a few. Having the Elders and Deacons going out into the community, inviting a neighbor to "come join us." Having the Session brainstorm ideas on how to get more people to come in, while at our monthly meeting. This will be ongoing.
