From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Lambertville Church Family,

I feel so blessed by the Lord to have been called to be your pastor!

I am truly grateful that we've been able to meet in our large, air conditioned sanctuary during this pandemic – a great gift to us in a time when many other congregations are able to worship together only online. It's been a joy to begin the process of getting to know each one of you, even as wearing our masks and keeping a safe distance has made our interactions a bit awkward and difficult at times – especially for those of us (like me) who are a bit hard of hearing! Here is my goal, for me and for all of us: to "bear with one another in love" as we ask the Holy Spirit for an extra measure of humility, gentleness, and patience, and to "make every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:2-3).

I'm re-printing below the session's guidelines, recently sent out by e-mail, for protection against Covid-19. Our primary goal is everyone's health and safety, for ourselves and also for friends and family members with whom we come into contact. Our hope is that, by making our safety measures clear and following them, as many of us as possible will feel comfortable in joining together for worship, even as we trust the Holy Spirit to guide each of us in our week-by-week decisions. My prayer is that everyone feels comfortable and part of our church family whether they feel led to join us in person or remain at home.

- 1. Please stay home if you are sick, have a fever, have been around someone potentially exposed to Covid-19, or are still under a 14-day quarantine following travel to a state on the NJ travel advisory list.
- 2. Please wear a mask covering your nose and mouth at all times while you are inside of our building and maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet from people who are not members of your household.
- 3. Please exit our building after our service has finished to have fellowship time outdoors unless you have a scheduled meeting or other reason to remain inside.

I'd like us to understand these guidelines as a way of serving the Lord Jesus by loving our neighbors, taking extra effort and making sacrifices for the well-being of others. Just as the Good Samaritan went out of his way to help a neighbor in need at his own inconvenience, and paid a cost to care for this wounded traveler, I want to encourage us to make sacrifices (staying home when it's prudent, wearing a mask, keeping appropriate distance, and minimizing indoor fellowship) to protect others from the spread of Covid-19.

We can look with hope and confidence to the Lord who is able to heal the nations of the world from this pandemic. The Lord is able to bring strength and recovery to those who are sick; comfort to the grieving; guidance for our scientists and doctors; sustenance for our medical personnel and caregivers; and protection for each one of us.

Just Sayin'...

During the past several years I have had the need to remove several trees on my property due to the infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer, which chews into the tree and the tree eventually dies. The tree then becomes a safety hazard and needs to be cut down. As the stumps on some of the trees are intact, new life has sprung out and now appears as though a new tree has been planted. I hope that maybe this is the case and the roots are strong enough to support the new branches that are sprouting.

Some tree roots are shallow and others are very deep into the ground. The shallow tree roots can be pulled out, toppling the tree when there are high winds, heavy rains or snowfalls, and loose soil. Other trees have very deep and sturdy roots that can be depended upon to secure the tree against storms and other disasters. A tree's root systems does not only depend on the type of tree, but also on the tree's environment. The better the environment for growth, the deeper the roots. This deeply rooted support system allows the tree to flourish, growing taller and wider each year.

The same can be said about each one of us in our walk with Jesus. The better the learning and caring environment, the better our roots are established in Jesus. The times that we are going through right now are similar to the powerful storms that can break apart those trees without a good foundation. Without a good Biblical foundation, we may flounder or even forget how Jesus strengthens and protects us.

We can strengthen ourselves by reading the Word more often, by speaking with Jesus through prayer, by relying on others to help support us and remind us how Jesus has brought us to this point in time. We can depend on our environment to get us through the rough times in our lives and encourage us to grow and allow us to be the best environment for others, so that they also may grow and mature. Remember, being a follower of Jesus is not something that we inherit—it is something that we choose. An environment of believers who care for others provides for good decisions and creates growth.

To continue with the tree analogy, they say that the acorn doesn't fall far from the tree. If you were look at the lineage of successful Christians, you'd see that many of their descendants are also successful. Take Jonathan Edwards, the eighteenth-century preacher, for example. Edwards's eleven children no doubt inherited intelligence and charisma from their famous preacher father. But the Christian environment that they grew up in probably had more of an influence on their development, and that of their own families. A study of his hundreds of descendants, conducted about 150 years after Edwards's death in 1758, found that they included a US vice president, three senators, three state governors, the deans of a law school and a medical school, 13 college presidents, 30 judges, 60 doctors, 75 military officers, 100 clergymen, and 285 college graduates.

When the parents are faithful and follow the Word of God, God blesses them as well as the generations that follow. In Genesis, God promised Abraham his future generations would be blessed. God's promises cannot be forgotten, removed, or changed. It is the Word of God. So when storms and disastrous situations come upon us, be strong and rooted in the word of God and remember that God has given His word that encourages us to new life.

Please Read Joshua 1: 1-10

• Integrity-God's way. When God says he will do something or not do something-he always keeps his promise; whether it takes moments or generations to come to fulfillment.


How comforting to claim verses 9 and 10 for our own. But before 9 and 10, comes verse 8. "Study this book of instruction continually. Meditate on it day and night so you will be sure to obey everything written in it. Only then will you prosper and succeed in all you do. "You and I know that the more quality time we spend in God's scriptures, the healthier our attitudes are, and the easier it is to meet life's challenges.

Many times we want to claim God's promises while neglecting our part of the covenant. Yes, God is always a covenant keeper even when we are not. However, how much greater is our blessing when we become part of the process.

Just as he encourages Joshua to be strong and courageous, do not be afraid or discouraged, because the Lord your God is with you wherever you go!

Believe in your heart that God speaks those same words over each of His followers, (you and I), and we must repeat them frequently to our children and grandchildren, as they embark on their future. (Read Deuteronomy 6: 4-9.)







Just for Kids.....

Review of Minutes: Session reviewed the minutes from the April 20, 2020 Session Business Meeting. A motion was called to accept the Minutes as written. All were in favor. Session reviewed the February 16, 2020 Congregational Meeting Minutes. A motion was called to accept the Congregational Meeting Minutes as written. All were in favor. The approved Minutes will be printed and included in the Book of Minutes along with pages of the Annual Report pages 1-21. There was a motion for the Agenda for tonight's meeting to be approved and to accept the revised Agenda that was sent out on Thursday May 14, 2020 via email to the Session and Rev. Leasure. The Election of the Clerk of the Corporation and President of the Corporation- Bylaws for First Presbyterian, Lambertville New Jersey, have to be drafted. Rich Hopkins will be drafting these up for our church. This will be discussed further at an upcoming Session Business Meeting.

Calendar Highlights from June-August 2020:

All in-person church services/activities are suspended at this time, due to the Coronavirus. The last Sunday for the 10:30 am worship service is Sunday June 7, 2020. The 9:30 am service starts on June 14, 2020 and run until Labor Day weekend. As of now, the Joint Service with our Sister Churches is being determined. The date is Sunday July 5, 2020, Holcombe-Jimison Farm at 10:00 am. Ken Good/Titusville Presbyterian will be hosting Communion on Sunday June 7th via Zoom. Re-opening church services in the near future will be determined soon. The Session will be having a Business Meeting at some time in July at 6:30 pm. A date for the meeting will be determined shortly.

Pastoral Search Committee- Has been praying for a candidate to become our pastor at First Presbyterian. A job description and job package has been presented to the candidate for review. Rich Hopkins and Heather McIntyre have put together a salary package and this is being discussed. There will be a Zoom meeting with the New Brunswick Presbytery on Tuesday June 2, 2020/Committee on Ministry to possibly to approve our candidate. Also, the new pastor's hours were being reviewed. More information to come soon.

Building and Grounds- Pat Durborow/Don Pidcock

The buildings have been continually checked by Don Pidcock and Pat Durborow. All seems to be ok. Nate will check out the soffits on the church building when he is able to do so. In the meantime, the gate to the gym is still closed with caution tape. The Kitchen is to be painted at some point. The heating (boilers) has not been resolved, but Heather McIntyre is looking into getting another heating company to come in to service them. More to follow. The Iron Fence surrounding the church was not discussed at this time.

Plaque for Dr. Henry-Don Pidcock has commssioned LaNelle Gallagher to design the plaque to thank Dr. Henry for his vision of having the Gym built. Pat Durborow discussed a plaque that was found in the basement, this was possibly an old plaque honoring Dr. Henry. Heather will set this up and give information to Sue in the Church Office. The deposit for the Shad Fest for the use of the Gym is being refunded to the Lambertville Chamber of Commerce, due to the Shad Fest being postponed. The Poster Auction is being held online this year. The COC will not be using our Gym this year for the Shad Fest.

Lowell Hunter Estate- Rich Hopkins is working with the State of New Jersey to have the Lowell Hunter Estate closed.

Zoom Meeting 7:15 pm-Our Pastoral Candidate spoke with our Session regarding the Job Description and Salary Package. Joanne DiBlasi and Heather McIntyre led the discussion. All Session Members were able to speak to our candidate. Motions to approve the Job Description and Salary Package were put forth. Both were approved. After a Zoom discussion with the New Brunswick Presbytery and the Committee on Ministry on June 2, 2020, and if our candidate is approved, the starting date for the candidate will be on July 6, 2020. The Pastoral Search Committee will continue to meet if/when our candidate is approved.

Sight & Sound- The trip to Sight & Sound in November 2020 was discussed. Rich Hopkins read an email from our Coordinator of the event, Karen Thatcher. Our trip was paid in full, but as of this date, all shows have been postponed due to the Coronavirus. We expect to get an email from Karen, in the future if the show has been cancelled and if our money is to be refunded.

Holcombe Scholarship- A **motion** was called for 2 of our 2020 High School Graduates to receive the scholarship. The **motion** was approved. Danielle Fisher and Zach Griffiths will be receiving the scholarships. Congratulations to both Danielle and Zach.

Youth Group Ministry/Sunday School- Mark Dudick/Carol Griffiths

Mark Dudick spoke regarding the Youth Group. The youth group is meeting virtually at this time. If any of our youth are interested, Mark will forward their information to his daughter Ella. She is a participant in the youth group.

Junior Deacons- Carol Griffiths spoke regarding the Junior Deacons. Danielle Griffiths will be our point of contact when the Jr. Deacons get started. This will most likely be in September 2020.

Moderator Time-Rev. Byron Leasure

Reverend Leasure spoke and said that our June 22, 2020 Session Business Meeting will be done via Zoom. When church services open up, examples would be: Holcombe-Jimison on July 5, 2020 and Sight & Sound in November 2020, to contact our insurance to see what our liability would be. Also to possibly to have Session Meetings in July/August.

Budget and Finance-Rich Hopkins/Heather McIntyre

Our Year to Date Summary is that we are down \$7400 as of May 2020, this is mostly due to the fact that church wasn't in session from mid-March until June 7, 2020. This was reviewed by Heather to the Session. Our investments with Morgan Stanley are stable at this time. Heather will contact the Duryea Agency to set up a time that Dennis Duryea can come and talk with Session regarding our Annual Insurance Review. This will be done sometime in the fall 2020.

Lowell Hunter Estate- Rich Hopkins is working with the State of New Jersey to have the Lowell Hunter Estate closed. We should be receiving our final distribution from the estate shortly.
