Prayer does not need any special time or season-just when there is a need or nudge by God.


The Deacons prayers are multifaced:



Devotion – Karen Thatcher

When we are in times of despair, trouble, pain, fear when we are anxious, distraught, and worried . . . God's Word seems to bubble up from within, verses and psalms that we have had memorized as children help to sooth our pain, strengthen and give us courage, provide hope – Psalm 23 does this for me as it reminds us of some of God's most precious hope-giving promises.

Psalm 23 is a beautiful reminder of God's love for us. Even in the presence of darkness, we will have a reason to rejoice! We don't have to only rejoice when evil has left, but we can laugh in the presence of all who is against us because He is still with us! The Psalm is so well known and so incredibly rich with peace and blessing, yet often we can become so 'familiar' with the verses and chapters of God's word that they almost lose the important message that God is wanting to instill within our hearts.

The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want – Promise of Security

Philippians 4:19 – But my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters – Promise of Happiness and Peace

Psalm 13:5 - But I have trusted in thy mercy; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation Matthew 11:28 – Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

He restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake - Promise for Strength and Guidance

Nehemiah 8:10 - . . . for the joy of the Lord is your strength

Psalm 119: 105 - Thy word is a lamp unto my feet.

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear not evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me – Promise of Assurance and His Presence

Moderator Time - Rev. Brad Morgan

The handout was referred to tonight. "Quick Mission Study Questions", and Brad asked what our next call process would be, and reflections to think about. The handout was discussed in more detail, but it will be revisited next month as well. We are still up in the air of whom our next pastor might be. Our church learned a lot from looking for our last pastor. Brad talked about the Trenton Thunder game on July 29th, and that our church will be attending with Mt. Airy, Mt. Airy has gotten 30 tickets, and we will do a sign-up sheet for our congregation. Sue will give a final count to Brad by July 9th. Mt. Airy will also be having a concert on May 21st, which will feature Jackie Schiffer, and he spoke about the joint service picnic at Holcombe-Jimison on Sunday July 2nd.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A **motion** was called to approve the minutes from April 17, 2023. All were in favor. The minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter.

Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence- I did a follow up email to Steve Emery regarding the organ on May 9th. He did get back to me to let me know that he would be sending 2 of his associates in the near future to look at and assess the organ. I will follow up with Session once this process happens. The May Pulpit Supply List was printed from the Presbytery's website, and handed out to Session.

Calendar Highlights from June- August 2023

Communion is scheduled for 6/4 and August 6th. Care & Share will continue on Communion Sundays with different groups hosting. See the upcoming bulletins for who is scheduled to give the Sermons and Accompanists. Our summer starts on June 11th, and is the first Sunday of the 9:30 am Service. The 10:30 am service will resume in September. Father's Day Sunday is June 18th, with the Opening of the Grill and a picnic will be after the service. The last Session Business for the summer, is June 19th. The last Men's Breakfast for the Summer is June 22nd at 8:00 am, place TBD. The Session Prayer meeting for July is on the 10th at 7:00 pm. The Ladies' Bible Study will be continuing on Wednesdays through the summer months at 2:00 pm. On Sunday July 2nd, is the Joint Service at 10:00 am with the River Churches, and bring your own picnic with something to share, after the service. The 9:30 am Worship Service continues through the month of August.

Worship and Music/Church Life – Joanne DiBlasi/Karen Thatcher

Insurance Review- Karen spoke about this, to let Session know that Dennis Duryea will come to give us our insurance review in the fall.

Children's Time- This is going well, and those who are giving the Sermon have also volunteered to give the children's time.

Sight & Sound- The list is full and there is a waiting list if someone cancels. Heather has paid everything up to date. Karen reached out to the bus company, and we would like to have a bus from Stout's. The fundraising of the soup sales during the winter and hot dog sales from Shad Fest, have helped us pay for the show and bus.

Accompanist/Pianist- Karen let Session know that we have received a few resumes for the position. Karen and the other committee members will look at the resumes and contact those who have applied. God has blessed us with those who have been playing, and Karen will reach out to Andrew and Lucia to see if they are available for the open upcoming dates. The job description is on the "Call Finders" page on our Presbytery's website.

Don is available to assist if needed during the summer, if there are any last minute changes.

Building and Grounds - Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Don Pidcock

The **new technology** to Livestream on YouTube is ongoing. No word from the Presbytery on the information that was submitted regarding the grant for the new equipment.

Martinez Landscaping- Pat spoke about this, and the Westminster yard is clean.

Church Roof- Was discussed, we will get bids on fixing it, more information to follow.

Bathroom in Westminster House- Was discussed by Pat, maybe to have a 3 piece bathroom put behind the office/storage room. Then maybe when people come from out of town to do performances here, they can stay at Westminster House. Joanne mentions that Westminster House is in need of a lot of repairs, and that we need to look at the structure too.

Basement of Westminster House- Phil talked about the red brick, there is mold by the furnace. Maybe to put beams in, except if the wall isn't real red brick, and he'll get a name of a company to come out and look at the basement wall to see what can be done.

Church Front Door- Phil suggested to take the front doors off to lift the sill to clean it and replace the doors to see if they will open/close better.

Budget and Finance – Heather McIntyre

Our Year-to-Date Summary was given out and was discussed, from 1/1-5/15/23, and we are over in our Plate \$272.40.

Lowell Hunter Estate- There has been no update at this time, but Heather will keep Session informed of any progress.

Usage of the Gym for LPS during the 2023-2024 School year- Originally a fee of \$550.00 was decided by Session, but Jim Troutman spoke with the school, and let Phil know that their amount was \$480.00 per month. Jim had said that if there was a problem with the amount, that he would take the difference from basketball. Session decided that the \$480.00 per month would be sufficient. Sue will reach out to Jim to see who the point of contact is at LPS to get our Facility Use form filled out, and insurance certificate listing our church as the additional insured.

Westminster House- Heather talked about her discussion with Justin from Elizabethtown Gas, and the heating system. We are waiting to hear back from Justin.

Unclaimed Funds-Heather has been working on this, and will keep Session updated.

Boy Scouts- Don- There are no updates at this time. We received some correspondence, Don looked this over, and no action was needed. Rich Hopkins is still being kept in the loop regarding what is going on with the Boy Scout lawsuit.

Shad Fest 2023- The Deacons raised \$615.00 to use for their many outreaches. The Fish Pond raised \$350.00 to send to Rolling Fork United Methodist in Rolling Fork, MS, to help with their disaster relief from the tornadoes which struck the area in March 2023. Phil suggested maybe to use the other side (the open space in the front of the church) for a game of some kind for the older children that come during Shad Fest.

Sunday School/Junior Deacons – Joanne DiBlasi/Don Pidcock

Sunday School- Don let the Session know that June 4th will be the last Sunday for the Children's Sunday School. We are looking for more teachers to teach for the next Sunday School year starting in the fall.

Junior Deacons- Joanne said that the Jr. Deacons are doing well.

Missions – Joanne DiBlasi

The Mission Team- There are no meetings that are coming up at this time.

Continuing of Education- Elders are encouraged to continue in and share the word of God through reading His Word, devotions, prayer and to be involved in education.

Elders-Are to continue Pastoral Care as needed.
