Where Do We Find Rest

We are tired... We are always on the go. We live by a calendar. Alarms remind of us of all the places that we need to be... We search for better ways to organize our time, ways to be more productive each day. Our physical and mental health pay the price for this busy life. The average American does not get enough sleep. Stress costs the United States \$300 billion dollars per year.

This problem is not getting any better. We read articles about self care. We practice meditation, yoga and mindfulness. We turn to alcohol and sleeping pills to help us rest.

We continue to spend money to have this busy lifestyle and then we spend money to relax.

Even as Christians who know we should "worry about nothing, pray about everything", we accept this lifestyle. We stay busy, we stay stressed. We continue to tell ourselves that we will enjoy life when things calm down. We will enjoy life when school lets out for the summer, when this sports season ends, when your kids are out of diapers, when you are finally able to retire... there is always a time in the future when life will calm down.

When do we rest? Many of us stay awake at night, worrying and stressing. How do we stop this endless cycle of stress, feeling exhausted, not just physically, but feeling exhausted down to your soul...

Let's take a look at the beginning, when God created the world, on the seventh day he rested. Why did God rest? It doesn't say that God was tired. He rested to look over what he created and enjoy it. Wow.

Psalm 147:5 tells us "Great is our Lord, and mighty in power; his understanding is infinite." God is all powerful; he never tires and never needs to rest... If we desire to experience the eternal state of rest in the Lord, we need to prioritize that on our to do list. "The fruit of righteousness will be peace, its effects will be quietness and confidence forever" Isaiah 32:17. "For only we who believe can enter his rest" Hebrews 4:3.

In order to enter the eternal period of peace, we need to learn to take time out to rest in the Lord. To purposefully stop doing active things... To sit and listen... 



April 17, 2023 Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Devotion – Don Pidcock

When we have our men's breakfast we have been meeting at Sneddon's Deli because it is convenient and easy for everyone to be together. But if you asked about Aaron about his Deli, he would tell you its all about LOCATION, LOCATION! And then if you asked Pastor Brad about what is important to him, I am sure he would say PRAYER, PRAYER!

But aside from Location and Prayer, Jesus would probably tell you that TIMING is so much more important as timing is everything! TIMING, TIMING, TIMING.

Jesus knew that the success of His ministry is directly related to when it happens. How many times did Jesus tell His disciples—don't tell anyone. Often-then showtime.

He tells us that in *Ecclesiastes 8:6* FOR THERE IS A PROPER TIME AND PROCEDURE FOR EVERY MATTER—THOUGH A person's MISERY WEIGHS HEAVILY UPON themselves. Meaning, that even though you may think its not the right time as you are so busy and overwhelmed,

But Jesus knew He had a contract or covenant to fulfill as He knew, as our recently Retired Lawyer Rich Hopkins aka "Hops" would say that "Time is of the essence", meaning timing is material to preforming of a contract or obligation.

He will also be bringing a small band with him, and we will help them with their set up. With his show on Friday evening, 4/21, the Deacons will be supplying refreshments after. He is performing his shows for free, for our church, and will be taking a "Love" offering during the Friday night show. He will also be performing on Saturday at 2:00 pm during Shad Fest, and will be here on Sunday morning for our 9:00 am service. The Women's Retreat is the weekend of May 19-21, and is held at the Sandy Cove Retreat Center in Maryland. 14 people are attending, and there is a possibility of maybe going from 2 nights to 1 night for next year. Brad will help to spread the word to other churches in the area. LaNelle also mentions and Phil talked about maybe having a Men's retreat in the future. LaNelle left the meeting after speaking.

<u>Around the Room -</u> The Elders, Brad and myself went around the room and shared our concerns. Brad closed this section with prayer.

Moderator Time - Rev. Brad Morgan

Brad was reflecting on his time as a Hospital Chaplain, and was asking for God's discernment. This was a preface to the handout that was passed out- "Quick Mission Study Questions" and asked that Session go over these questions, and to come back next month with their reflections and possibly to answer, "where do we go from here?"

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A **motion** was called to approve the minutes from March 20, 2023. All were in favor. The minutes will be sent to Sue/Church Office to be printed in the Book of Minutes and to be included in the Church Newsletter.

The April Pulpit Supply List was printed from the Presbytery's website, and handed out to Session. I will be printing this monthly and giving out the list at the business meetings. We had received an email from the Trenton Thunder regarding our church attending a baseball game this summer. They have a Faith and Family Night on July 29th. This may be a possibility, Pastor Brad said that Mt. Airy had gone to a game last year, and he will reach out to his congregation and get back to Session to see if our church and Mt. Airy could go as a group.

At this time Don asked if we should give Fred Kenney and honorarium for his service on Sunday April 23^{rd} . Pat made a **motion** to pay a minimum of \$300.00 with a max of \$400.00, to Fred Kenney, the **motion** was 2^{rd} . All were in favor.

Calendar Highlights from May-July 2023

Communion is scheduled for 5/7, and 6/4 with Pastor Gregory. Care & Share will continue on Communion Sundays with different groups hosting. See the upcoming bulletins for who is scheduled to give the Sermons and Accompanists. The National Day of Prayer is May 4th, and our church will be open. Pat will be getting the flowers for Mother's Day 5/14 for all the ladies. The Women's Retreat is at Sandy Cove in Maryland on May 19-21. On May 21st there will be a concert at Mt. Airy Presbyterian, more details to follow. Pastor Gregory will be here for our church service on Sunday May 28th. There will be Men's Bible Study at Sneddon's on May 25th and June 22nd at 8:00 am. The last Sunday for the 9:00 am Sunday School and the 10:30 am Worship is June 4th. June 11th is the first Sunday of the 9:30 am Service. The 10:30 am service will resume in September. The last Session Business is June 19th. The Session Business Meetings will resume in September. Prayer Meetings may be held over the July and August, Session will let Sue know, so she can put them on the calendar. The Ladies' Bible Study will be continuing on Wednesdays through the summer months at 2:00 pm. On Sunday July 2nd, is the Joint Service at 10:00 am with the River Churches. Brad will get in touch with Karen Thatcher regarding this. He has spoken to Mary Lou (POC) from Holcombe-Jimison and firmed up the date. More details to follow soon.

Worship and Music/Church Life – Joanne DiBlasi

Insurance Review- Not discussed tonight.

Children's Time- For those who have been giving the Sermons, have been giving the Children's Time, this is continuing to run smoothly.

Sight & Sound- The list is full and there is a waiting list if someone cancels.

Accompanist/Pianist- Sue updated Session with the Accompanist List. We are still in need of a permanent Accompanist/Director of Music, and we are still seeking the right candidate.

Building and Grounds – Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Don Pidcock

Martinez Landscaping- Pat spoke about this, and they were here recently and cleaned up the Westminster yard.

Small Church Bathroom- Pat and Phil talked about how the small bathroom looks good, and the changes that were made were well received.

The **new technology** to Livestream on YouTube is ongoing. The Grant for updating the equipment, had to be resubmitted to the Presbytery, this was done by Sue, and Casey Carbone's recommendations were sent with the information. We are now waiting to hear from the Presbytery to see if our Grant was approved, and what the next steps might be. More to follow. All went around the room and discussed the YouTube Livestream, and it is going well, but Phil

did say that once we get up and running with the new equipment, it will most likely run better. Right now Stephen McCloughan is using his phone to record the Livestream.

Budget and Finance – Heather McIntyre

Subsplash- This is our online giving tool on the Church Website, and is being used to get donations, and can be an answer to our prayers for people to donate that aren't able to attend the in-person worship service.

Our Year-to-Date Summary was given out and was discussed, from 1/1-4/17/23, and we are over in our Plate \$1468.88. The Wells Fargo Bank, a few branches have been closed. There is a possibility that our church may be looking for a new bank to transfer our accounts to. More to follow.

Lowell Hunter Estate- It was discussed that we emailed the Law Office of Buchanan in Lambertville, and for him not to act on our behalf. Session asked Heather to send Buchanan something formally in a letter asking the Buchanan Law Firm not to act on our behalf. An email was sent by Rich Hopkins to them back in June 2022, so Heather will follow up with another letter. This has been an ongoing issue, and the State of NJ has also been involved. Heather will keep Session informed of the progress.

Usage of the Gym for LPS- Phil McCloughan spoke with Jim Troutman, about Lambertville Public School and using the gym on Mondays and Fridays for the school year 2023-2024, while their building is getting renovated. Jim suggested \$140.00 per week, or \$560.00 per month. It was discussed weather we were going to charge what is on our Facility Use Agreement, or if the above amount is acceptable. What amount should be charged? Brad answered to be responsible to the community and be gracious to the children.

Phil made a **motion** for \$550.00 per month, for LPS to use the gym from September 2023 to June 2024, just for Mondays and Fridays, the **motion** was 2nd, and all were in favor. Phil will get in touch with Jim Troutman and give him the information. Jim is our point of contact with LPS.

Snow removal was discussed, and Martinez will do our snow removal as well as our landscaping.

Westminster House- Heather talked about her discussion with Justin from Elizabethtown Gas, and the heating system. Justin thinks that 80 percent of the heating system can be covered by Elizabethtown Gas, if we decided to go with a new furnace. Also, should we continue fixing the furnace that we have now, and using Garden State Heating or someone else? Since Garden State isn't fixing the issue, and their bills have been high, the Session may be looking for a new company to go to for maintenance. Heather will keep the Session posted on the heating system.

Boy Scouts- No updates at this time. Our Elder Liaison to the Boy Scouts is Don Pidcock.

Sunday School/Junior Deacons – Joanne DiBlasi/Don Pidcock

Sunday School- Don spoke that Sunday School is continuing at this time.

Junior Deacons- Joanne mentions what the Junior Deacons could be responsible for. Some examples are- the offering, ringing the bell before the worship service, encourage the children to bring a canned good to Sunday School, for Peter's Pantry outside. Pat suggested that on Communion Sunday, to remind all to bring a canned good. Sue will put this information in the upcoming bulletins.

Missions – Joanne DiBlasi

The Mission Team- Missions will be meeting on April 30th or May 7th. The checks went out to the missionaries, and all is going well. We will let Fred Kenney (of "Pete") that Heather will be issuing a check out to him.

Continuing of Education- Elders are encouraged to continue in and share the word of God through reading His Word, devotions, prayer and to be involved in education.
