Hymn Time:

"Lead On, O King Eternal" Ernest W. Shurtleff (1862-1917)

Ernest was about to graduate from seminary in 1887. His classmates at the seminary, recognizing Ernest's poetic ability, asked him to write their class poem. Ernest told them he would write them a song they could all sing as they went out into the world to follow the King of kings.

While many of the metaphors in this hymn speak of war, Ernest's true battle strategy comes in verse two. It is through "deeds of love and mercy" we achieve victory in this world.

After pastoring three churches in the U.S., Ernest and his wife, Helen, went to Europe. He organized the American Church in Frankfurt, Germany. Then, Ernest and Helen went to Paris to organize worship services for American students living there. When World War I started, Ernest and Helen threw themselves into war relief work. They formed an organization that provided clothing, medical care, and food, and found jobs, schooling and housing for destitute women and children. Ernest died in 1917 while performing these "deeds of love and mercy". After Ernest's death, the organization became known as the Shurtleff Memorial Committee and was later absorbed by the Red Cross.

Ernest's and Helen's lives remind us of the quote attributed to St. Francis of Assisi: "Preach the gospel at all times. If necessary, use words."


